## OVERVIEW OF PRACTICES

### Introduction

Sustainable Development Networking Programme (SDNP) is a non-profitable organization engaged in network development programme for environment awareness, education, health care and countryside development projects in the rural areas of Bangladesh.

### Activity

- Awareness – through Internet Service through “ Green City: Solid Waste” program
- Development of projects in rural areas on recycling and reuse of solid waste

Presently, SDNP is implementing point to point and point to multipoint radio link wireless connectivity to develop the proposed nationwide data backbone that can act as a pipeline for Internet Service Providers (ISPs), government agencies, and corporations. In the subsection “ Green City: Solid Waste” is an activity providing information regarding increased generation of local solid waste, dangers of land filling and incineration, the fundamental approaches to reducing waste, merits of reusing and recycling, disposal bans on locally recyclable materials or mandatory recycling for businesses and residents, etc.
