OVERVIEW OF PRACTICES

Introduction

Tanam Untuk Kehidupan (TUK) is an environment concerned artist community in Salatiga, Central Java found in 2006. TUK is actively involved in conducting campaigns on the issues of water conservation and the environment to the community through art and cultural practice.

3R Good Practice

- The Eco-Friendly Kampong Project

This project was implemented to increase the awareness level in the community regarding the importance of proper waste management and recycling. It focuses on the issue of reforestation/planting within the neighborhood and guides the community to produce compost from organic waste. Workshops and monthly forums were conducted on waste sorting and compost among all groups involved in the program.

- Recycled Trash Program

TUK's Recycled Trash Program involved training, set up, production and marketing of TUK's Recycled Products. several innovative and quality products were designed and made on a small scale by TUK. Many of these samples were displayed in exhibition titled "Sisa: re-use, collaborations and cultural activism from Indonesia" at The University of Technology Gallery, Sydney in November 2007.

Outcome of Practice

- Organic fraction of domestic waste at eco-friendly Kampong locations is converted into compost.
- Plastic, metals, and other inorganic waste materials are used to make useful items.
- The exhibition with the products made of recyclable waste has generated positive response among the art community and local eco-businesses. In order to start the production and marketing of TUK's products on a larger scale, it established the Recycled Trash Program. Wallets/purses, pencil cases, bags, recycled plastic and tire sandals, necklaces, toys etc are some of the handmade products made from recycled materials.
