## OVERVIEW OF PRACTICES

### Introduction

Wisnu Foundation is a non-government environmental organization in Bali established in 1993. This organization was established by eight Indonesian professionals with a mission of increasing awareness and public participation for a better environment. Wisnu Foundation has been able to manage their waste in an environment friendly way and in part were able to participate in the governance of their locality.

### 3R Good Practice

Waste Management in Pupuan Tabanan was the first project to offer a solution for the waste problem in Bali implemented by Wisnu Foundation. Initial step taken by this Foundation was conducting a waste management survey on the island. This revealed that 80% of Bali's waste was organic matter. With a clear idea of the potential of the waste for recycling and composting, the Foundation emphasized on community involvement in tackling the waste problem. A small scale, integrated waste management project was devised by this organization in accord with local needs and capacity in Pupuan Tabanan. The project involved in the collection and separation of household waste and the production of compost from organic waste.

### Outcome of Practice

The compost produced is sold as fertilizer. The waste management project in Pupuan Tabanan has been able to sustain itself economically and increase the awareness level and public participation. This project has become an example for other Wisnu Foundation projects and is considered to be a great step forward to increase accountability among local bodies for solid waste management and disposal practices.
